



#### "How did the Army get involved?"

- Rivers and Harbors Act of 1899 (protects navigation)
  - Prohibits unauthorized obstructions to navigation
  - Regulates work in and structures over/under/through navigable waters
- Section 404 of the Clean Water Act (protects the resource)
  - Regulates the discharge of dredged and or fill material into all waters of the United States, including wetlands



## The Federal Clean Water Act

- Section 401- Requires a state water quality certification (Often triggered by the 404 application)
- Section 404 Requires a permit before dredged or fill material may be discharged into waters of the United States.
- Standard permits include:
  - Individual Permit
  - Letter of Permission

The National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA) of 1966, as amended, requires that federal agencies take into account the effects of their undertakings on historic properties. In addition to direct actions of the federal government, federal undertakings are projects involving a permit or license, funding, or other assistance or approval from a federal agency. Section 106 of the NHPA and its implementing regulations at 36 CFR Part 800 lay out review procedures that ensure historic properties are considered in federal planning processes.

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
